This Agreement addresses the review and oversight of the Preliminary Engineering (PE) phase of the Project. The Department will use STP funds allocated to the Town for the Project and the Municipality will provide the non-federal match to the STP funds.

This Project consists of the development of a Greater Charlotte Regional Freight Mobility Plan. The Agency will develop a partnership with area agencies to initiate the study. The Department will reimburse 100% of eligible costs with Federal SPR funds (\$168,408) and state match (\$42,102) up to a maximum amount of \$210,510.

This Rail Agreement covers NSR's preliminary engineering and flagging costs for work within operating railroad right-of-way of the NCRR located along South Ridge Avenue in Concord. Work will be between mileposts 352.60 and 352.80, and between mileposts 352.92 and 352.93. The Department will be responsible for all costs incurred by NSR. The estimated project cost is \$50,000.

This Project consists of extension of an existing greenway from property owned by Duke Power west under US 21 (Turnersburg Highway) to the existing greenway at Pump Station Road. The Municipality is responsible for all phases of the Project. The Department shall reimburse 72% of approved eligible costs from TAP funds, not to exceed \$1,200,000. The Municipality will be responsible for providing the 28% (\$466,666) non-federal match and all costs that exceed the total estimated cost of \$1,666,666.

This Project consists of constructing missing sidewalk links, crosswalks and bicycle facilities to provide a connection between downtown Gastonia and Lineberger Park. This Supplemental Agreement is to provide additional funding in the amount of \$75,000 (80%) from CMAQ funds. The Municipality shall provide \$18,750 (20%) as the non-federal match and all costs that exceed the total estimated costs.

This Supplemental Agreement is to address the change in Project responsibilities. At the request of the Municipality, the Department shall administer the construction contract for the Project. The Department will utilize available CMAQ funds for 75% of the construction and inspection costs. The Municipality shall be responsible for the non-federal match (25%) and all costs that exceed the total estimated cost of \$5,844,175.

This Project consists of the repair of the sinkhole at the intersection of US 70 and 7th Street Southeast in Hickory. The Department shall be responsible for the design and construction of the sinkhole repair. The Department shall provide \$1,000,000 towards the cost of the Project. At the request of the Municipality, the Department shall include in its construction contract the construction of betterments including new sidewalk and powder-coated master arms and pedestrian pedestals. The estimated reimbursement from the Municipality is \$113,859.

This Project consists of the replacement of Gaston Bridge #8 with an arch culvert. It also includes the construction of sidewalk, curb and gutter, decorative railing, guardrail and resurfacing of SR 2209 (Weslyn Avenue) the southern approach of the bridge and up to the intersection of NC 7 on the Northern approach. Based on consultation with Division Engineers, the General Maintenance allocation formula is comprised of 65% road and bridge inventory and 35% assessed and non-assessed need. Additionally, road and bridge asset inventory is weighted 70% and 30%, respectively. Pavement Preservation and Contract Resurfacing allocation formulas are comprised of 65% road inventory and 35% need. The Bridge Program allocation formula is based on need for structurally deficient bridges not already let or programed.

SCHEDULE I - GENERAL MAINTENANCE RESERVE

In accordance with the recommended allocations listed on Page 1, a total of \$467,583,999 has been made available for distribution. These funds will be used for Road and Bridge Maintenance, as well as support Enterprise level programs.

ROAD AND BRIDGE MAINTENANCE

This item, listed under General Maintenance Reserve, will be utilized for the purposes of continuing routine maintenance activities including, but not limited to, pavement patching, pavement markings, markers, signs, symbols, roadside vegetation management, drainage, unpaved shoulders, litter pickup, and other similar maintenance activities. Bridge related activities include, but are not limited to, repairing concrete bridge decks, girder painting, emergency bridge repair or replacement, replacing electrical components, foundation repair, installation of support bents, and flooring and rail repair. Replacing small critical bridges and pipes, and maintaining navigational lighting systems on high level bridges located over navigational waterways are also eligible activities. These expenditures will include both contract and force account maintenance.

ENTERPRISE PROGRAMS

Enterprise level programs are comprised of four main categories: State and Federal Obligations, Asset Maintenance and Operations, Research and Development, and Emergencies.

State and Federal Obligations are funds required either by state or federal laws, regulations or rules. Examples of such obligations include Inmate Labor, Asphalt Testing Labs Corrective Actions, Drug & Alcohol Testing, Railroad Signal Maintenance, and maintenance of Weigh Stations.

Asset Maintenance and Operations are funds used to assess and address statewide program needs. Examples include funding the condition assessment program, inspection of Non-NBIS bridges, sign structures, and high mast lighting, and maintenance repairs to assets such as traffic signals and renovating rest areas.

Research and Development are funds used to research, develop, and implement state of the art maintenance technologies, practices and procedures. Objectives of these programs include improving maintenance efficiencies and improving cost effectiveness.

Emergencies are funds used for weather related events, to cover unanticipated expenditures for non-declared emergency operations, as well as snow and ice equipment purchases.

The Inmate Labor allocation of \$9,140,000 was initially included as part of the inventory and needs based formula allocation. Following the formula distribution, each Division's allocation was proportionately reduced in accordance with a 3-year average utilization rate per Division.

SCHEDULE II - PAVEMENT PRESERVATION

Beginning in FY 2015, the General Assembly has provided funds to address preservation activities or treatments for asphalt pavement structures. Eligible activities include the following: chip seals, slurry seals, fog seals, sand seals, scrub seals, and cape seals. Microsurfacing, profile milling not covered by resurfacing, asphalt rejuvenators, and open graded asphalt friction course is also eligible. Additional preservation activities include overlays less than 1,000 feet in length, diamond grinding, joint sealing, dowel bar retrofit, and partial or full depth repairs and reclamations. Ultra-thin whitetopping, thin lift and sand asphalt overlays and asphalt crack sealing are also eligible pavement preservation activities. \$85,045,024 has been made available and will be distributed by the aforementioned inventory and needs based formula.

SCHEDULE III - CONTRACT RESURFACING

Of the total \$497,946,495 available, the staff recommends continuing to cash flow \$78,000,000 equally in each of the 14 Highway Divisions and is included in the allocation numbers. These activities will include placement of plant mixed asphalt, surface treatment seals, and recycling existing pavement. They will also include surface preparation, shoulder reconstruction, and traffic lane markings, performed by State Forces and by Contract. In accordance with current legislation, up to 15% of the funds may be used for widening existing narrow pavements. Additionally, a total of \$89,152,561 is distributed equally per County in accordance with Session Law 2015-241. It is also recommended that, of the total funds available, \$2,300,000 be allocated for the purpose of Pavement Condition Assessments on the Secondary system and \$525,000 be allocated for the purpose of Automated Assessments on the Primary system, leaving a balance of \$405,968,934 to be distributed based on each Division's pro-rata share of inventory and need.

SCHEDULE IV - BRIDGE PROGRAM

The Bridge Program formula reconciles Division bridge program assessed need with State bridge program assessed need to address structurally deficient bridges. Of the total \$242,374,444 available, it is recommended that \$10,000,000 be allocated to fund ongoing Preliminary Engineering activities on 132 projects started in 2016. Also, it is recommended that \$18,750,000 be allocated for Right-of-Way acquisition on 82 bridge projects in 2017 and \$46,250,000 be allocated for Construction of 34 bridge projects in 2017. Of the remaining funds, a uniform allocation of \$6,000,000 per Division is recommended to address needs that occur on a cyclical basis in each Division, leaving a balance of \$167,374,444 to be allocated based on assessed need.

Further detail regarding recommended allocations of these funds is addressed in Table 2 on page 5.

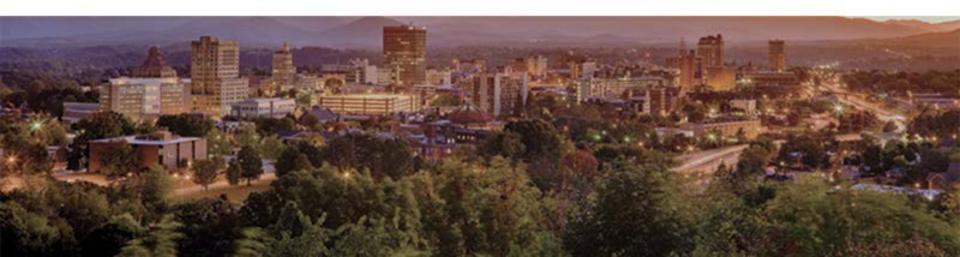

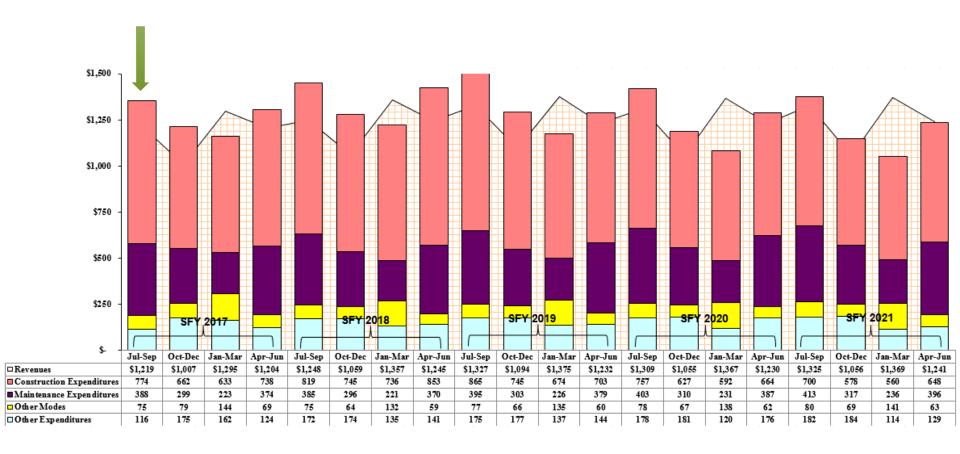

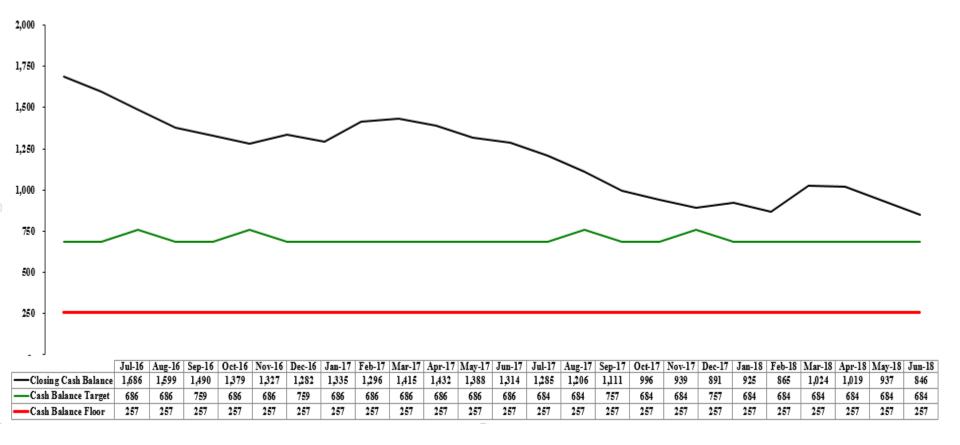


60 Month Cash Model Revenue & Expenditure Projections as of July 2016



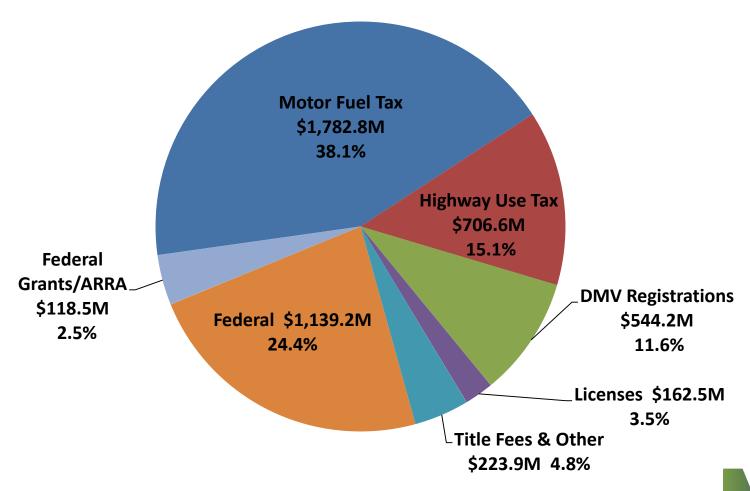


24 Month Cash Model Cash Projections as of July 2016





NCDOT Revenue Sources SFY2017 - \$4.7 Billion

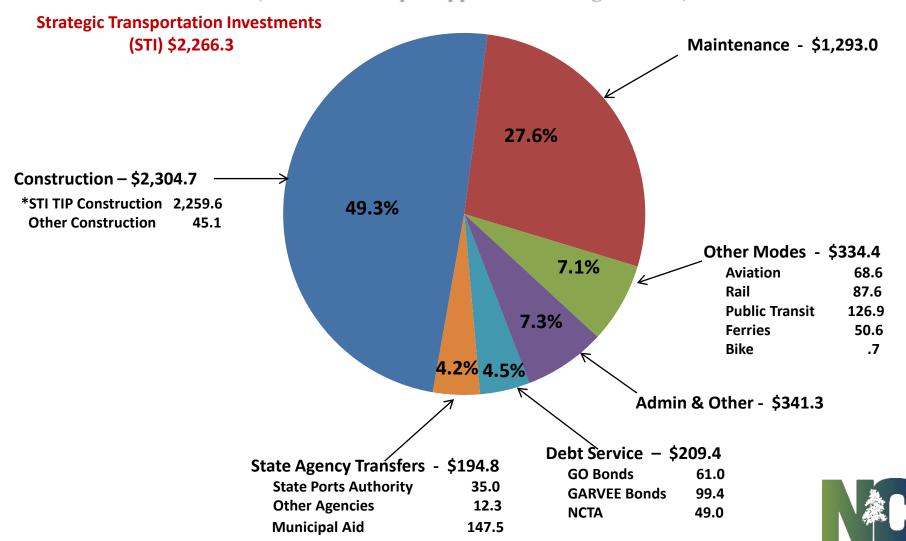

Uses of 2016-17 NCDOT Appropriations

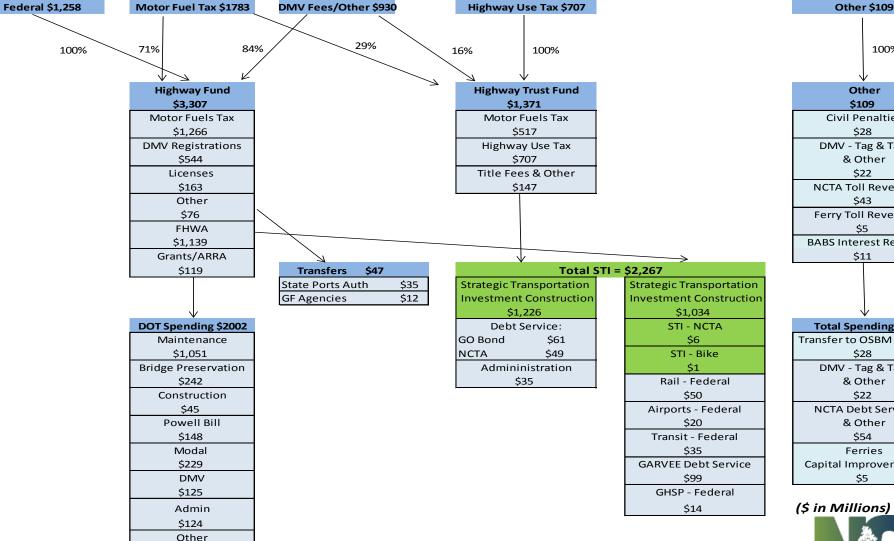

Product Evaluation Program (PEP)

The Product Evaluation Program reviews new and innovative technologies and products and maintains the Approved Products List for the Department. Our Geotechnical engineers recently met with Rick Stoehr. Director of Research and Development for NCFI Polyurethanes in Mount Airy. Mr. Stoehr provided a tour of the NCFI research facility and manufacturing plant. The engineers witnessed the product testing of NCFI's polyurethane foam product. NCFI has been producing polyurethane foam products since 1986. These chemical grouts are used for slab jacking to correct settlement and stability problems by injecting foam under concrete slabs to raise or lift slabs and fill voids under slabs in a minimally invasive way. The tests were conducted to determine how this type product performs in both dry and wet conditions. Voids under concrete slabs may be created with water ingress and water is typically present under slabs. This polyurethane grout product is a high density, closed celled

foam which makes it resistant to water penetration once cured. Injection requires a series of 5/8" holes through the slab and the foam then conforms to the size of the void. Scott Hidden is leading the effort to create a provision for these types of chemical grouts which will lead to new categories for the Approved Products List. Chemical grouts which have been submitted through the Product Evaluation Program are currently listed under the category of "Grouts-Chemical". Value Engineering Program (VEP)

We have completed three Value Engineering Studies recently: One Section of the Shelby Bypass (R-2707C), NC 211 in Brunswick County (R-5021), and two Sections of the Fayetteville Outer Loop (U-2519BA/BB). The last two Studies have been facilitated by Private Engineering Firms (PEF) and have given a different perspective on the process. We also used two PEF project experts in the first Study with good results. Our next three day VE Training Session is currently scheduled for late August. In the training, we will apply the entire VE process to projects I-4700A/B and I-4400C which will improve I-26 in Henderson and Buncombe Counties. We also have a study of NC 150 in Catawba and Iredell Counties (R-2307B) to be scheduled this fall. Professional Services Contracts and Requirements

Professional or Specialized Services Contracts contribute to the planning, design, maintenance, repair, and construction of transportation infrastructure.

- NC law requires professional services of an architectural or engineering nature be performed or approved by a person licensed, registered, or certified to provide the services.
- Examples include:
 - surveying and mapping
 - planning studies
 - environmental studies (biological evaluations, community impact assessments, noise and air studies)
 - preliminary engineering and design
 - geotechnical investigations
 - construction engineering and inspection

Procurement is a qualifications-based selection process in accordance with:

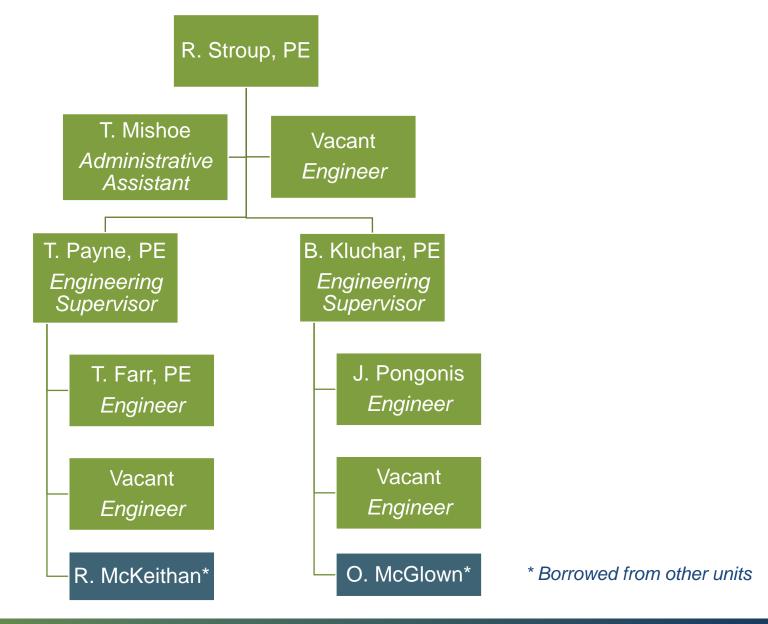
- NCDOT's "Policies and Procedures for Procurement and Administration of Major Professional or Specialized Services Contracts", adopted by the Board of Transportation on June 30, 2016 ("Policies and Procedures");
- 2. Appropriate laws and regulations are referenced in the "Policies and Procedures".

Definitions Related to Professional Services Contracts

- Letter of Interest (LOI) (Proposal) An expression of interest by a Firm for performing specific services as advertised by NCDOT.
- Limited Services Contract (LSC) (or Agreement) (LSA) An "as-needed basis" contract used to establish a maximum dollar amount for professional or specialized services to be performed during a specified contract period. During the contract period, task orders, which include scope of services, schedule, and total compensation, can be negotiated with the Firm. The Firm can begin work once a Notice to Proceed is issued.
- Project-Specific Contract A contract between NCDOT and consultant for the performance of services and defined scope of work related to a specific project or projects. The fully-executed Project-Specific Contract represents the full scope of services required by NCDOT.
- Purchase Order (PO) A "contract" that represents a Task Order or Work Order assignment given to a Firm, generally under a Limited Services Contract.

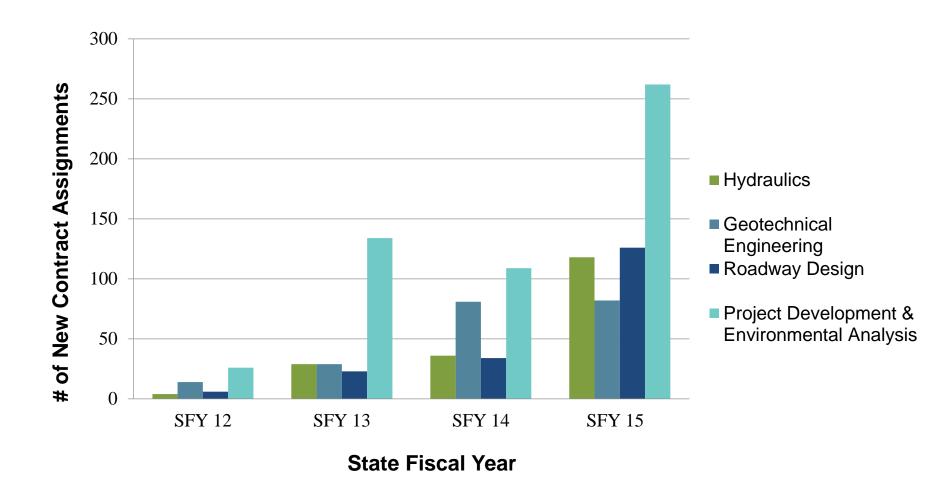

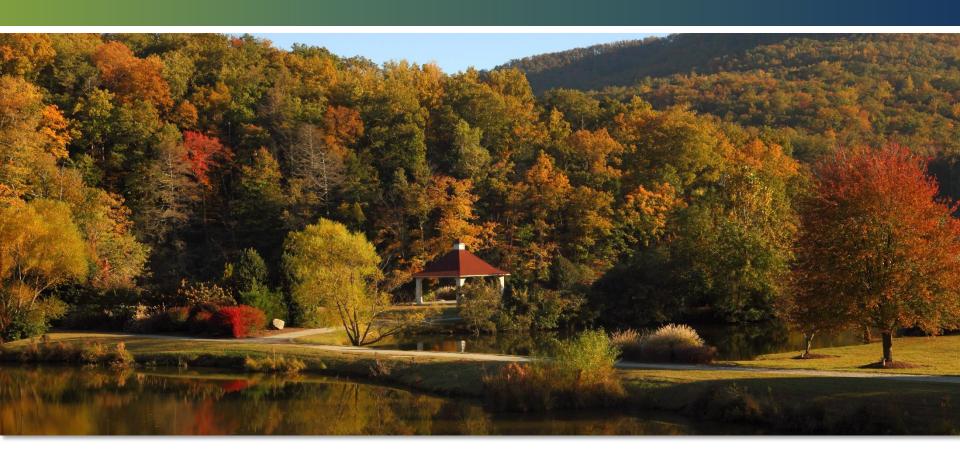

FY 17 MAINTENANCE ALLOCATIONS - DELBERT RODDENBERRY, PE Per Session Law 2016-94, the FY 2017 Appropriations for Maintenance which include the General Maintenance Reserve (GMR), Pavement Preservation, Contract Resurfacing and the Bridge Program, total approximately \$1.3B. In years past, the Maintenance appropriations came to the Department in 3 areas: Primary, Secondary and GMR. This year's funding was allocated a bit differently in that all the funds are transferred to the GMR. This gave the Department more flexibility to use the funds on either primary or secondary systems. As legislatively instructed, a workshop was held on July 7, 2016 with the Division Engineers, Division Maintenance Engineers and Chief Engineer's Office staff to discuss the distribution of the GMR funds to each of the 14 Divisions. The four enterprise programs are funded as follows: Emergences (\$90M), Research & Development (\$550,000), Asset Management & Operations (\$17.8M), and State & Federal Obligations (\$21.8M). The remainder of the funds is allocated to each of the 14 Divisions. At the workshop, the Divisions came to the DISCUSSION SUMMARY consensus that the allocation would be based 65% on inventory and 35% on assessed and non-assessed needs. The inventory is based on two components: 70% roads (lane miles) and 30% bridges (SF of deck area). In accordance with Session Law 2015-241, a total of \$89.2M of the \$497.9M of Contract Resurfacing appropriation is distributed equally to each of the counties, \$2.3M will be used for statewide pavement condition assessments, and the remaining funds are allocated by the inventory/needs distribution formula. Of the \$242M in the Bridge Program, \$75M was allocated for planning, right of way and construction of centrally-managed bridge projects. The remaining \$167M was distributed to the Divisions with each receiving a base of \$6M plus an amount distributed based on need. (The needs of each Division are based on the number of Structurally Deficient bridges.) The dollar distribution for the past FY and this FY were reviewed. In ensuing discussion, it was decided that a presentation on how needs are defined and calculated will come to the committee next month. **ACTIONS TAKEN**

3. FAYETTEVILLE OUTER LOOP UPDATI	E – Greg Burns, PE
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	The planning of the Fayetteville Outer Loop (I-295) project began in the late '80's. By 2005, the I-95 to Ramsey Street section was completed with the Ramsey Street to Bragg Boulevard section to open by August 2016 and the Bragg Boulevard to All American Freeway (AAF) to follow by the end of 2016. The section from AAF to Cliffdale Road will be completed in 2018 and completion of the loop is anticipated by 2025. When finished, the loop will be 39 miles, 254 total lane miles with 85 bridges and 4 flyovers. These structures cross several key corridors with some spanning up to approximately 300' requiring large girders up to 11' in height. One such structure originally required US 401 to be closed at night for up to 3 weeks for construction activities. The contractor developed an idea to preassemble the large girders and use multiple cranes launching from opposite directions that closed 401 for only one weekend. This project is vitally important to the area as it improves mobility and connectivity for the region and provides congestion relief and improved safety on the parallel corridors. The project also supports the Fort Bragg military base by providing interstate access to Fort Bragg as well as aiding in closing Bragg Boulevard through the base. Through the STI legislation, 5 new segments were funded. Cliffdale Road to Raeford Road was recently awarded as a design build contract with an anticipated completion of 2021, Raeford Road to Camden Road has a 2018 let, Camden Road to Parkton Road will let in 2020 and Parkton Road to I-95 south of Fayetteville will let in 2020. This final section was able to be accelerated from 2021 to 202 with the most recent revision of the STIP, made possible through HB97.

4. AMG CONSTRUCTION – LAMAR SYL	vester, PE
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Automated Machine Guidance (AMG) construction utilizes 3D design along with GPS to allow for stake-less construction. Prior to this technology, surveyors used plan sheets and cross sections to stake locations horizontally and vertically. What once was a 3-4 person operation highly dependent on trial and error built skill can now be accomplished 1 person operating a machine. Prior to AMG, survey stakes were set at 50′ intervals with workers pulling string lines to measure cuts and fills. The accuracy and speed of the work was dependent on the skill of the operator. AMG eliminates the need for much of the skilled manual control and labor involved in that traditional method saving time and money. Additional benefits include safety by limiting workers' exposure to moving equipment as well as grade conformity resulting in fewer errors requiring corrective action. Checking the accuracy of the work is still required but the inspectors can also utilize the 3D model and GPS for this work which equates to additional time savings. In 2009, NCDOT worked with the contracting industry to develop special provisions for AMG for Design-Build projects and expanded the use of the specification to Design Bid Build for large grading projects. In 2011, the project stake out manual addressed reducing the staking for AMG contracts and began allowing this technology on all NCDOT projects. Currently 93% of NCDOT contractors utilize AMG technology. The Department will continue to work with the contracting industry to further utilize this technology for project delivery while ensuring specifications are kept up to date.

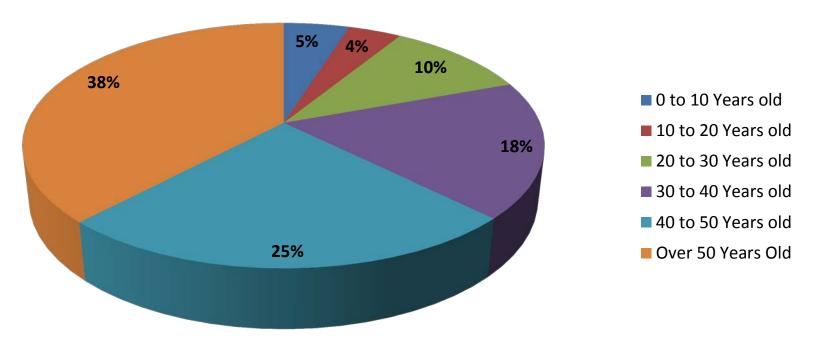

- Include perspective from a Statewide level.
- Provide early involvement and coordination with stakeholders.







Outreach - Residents

- Intensive outreach began Oct 2007/08.

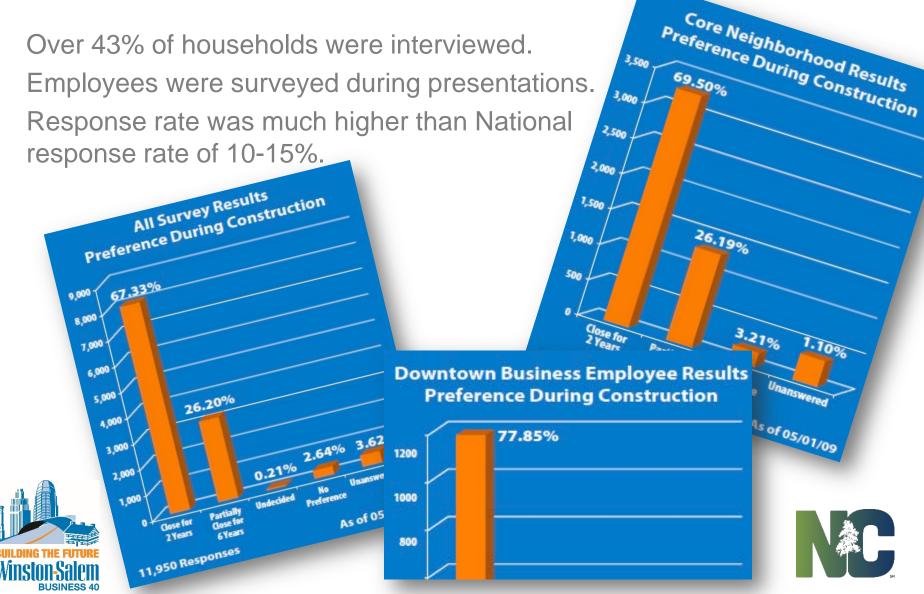

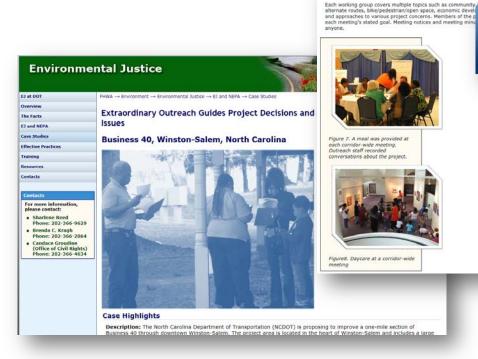

A decision needed to be made, early on in the project study, whether the construction of the project should be designed to take place over two years, with full closure of a section of Business 40, or six years, with partial closure of the highway. Early conversations with community leaders as part of the development of the PIP indicated that the community would prefer a six-year partial closure approach. However, NCDOT and their outreach team moved forward with an intensive strategy to find out what a broader spectrum of the community really

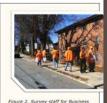
Door-to-Door Outreach

NCDOT used a different approach for reaching out to "Core Neighborhoods" and "Surrounding Neighborhoods." In the project map shown in Figure 1, Core Neighborhoods are shaded orange and Surrounding Neighborhoods are blue. The Core Neighborhoods were those that directly or indirectly touched the Business

40 project or had primary arteries that could be designated as an alternate route. These neighborhoods were contacted through an unprecedented door-to-door outreach process.

To conduct the outreach, the consultant team bired 75 individuals from the community. These individuals were identified through the resources gathered in the development of the PIP and through partnership with the Winston-Salem Urban League. The outreach team accepted the first 75 community members who showed up for a job and could pass a test that included the ability to read and write, describe the project correctly, answer project questions correctly, and use outreach techniques and sensitivities. Regarding project-related questions, survey staff were carefully instructed that they should not answer technical questions, but refer

individuals to the variety of methods through which they could speak with a project engineer. This was important to be sure that technical questions were not answered incorrectly by someone without sufficient knowledge and to ensure that the sam information was being shared across the community. All project messaging - including information conveyed by survey staff had to follow the "3 Cs" - consistent, concise, and clear

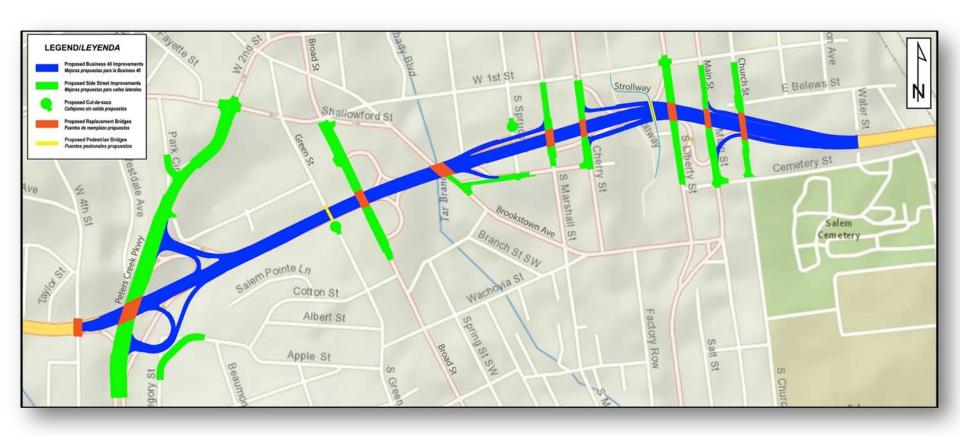

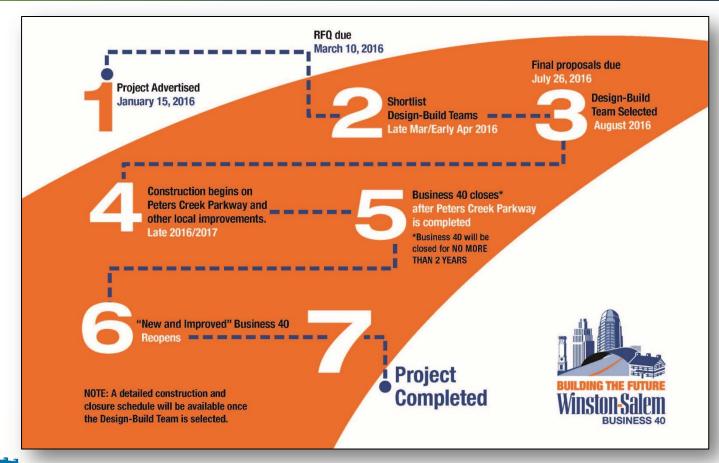

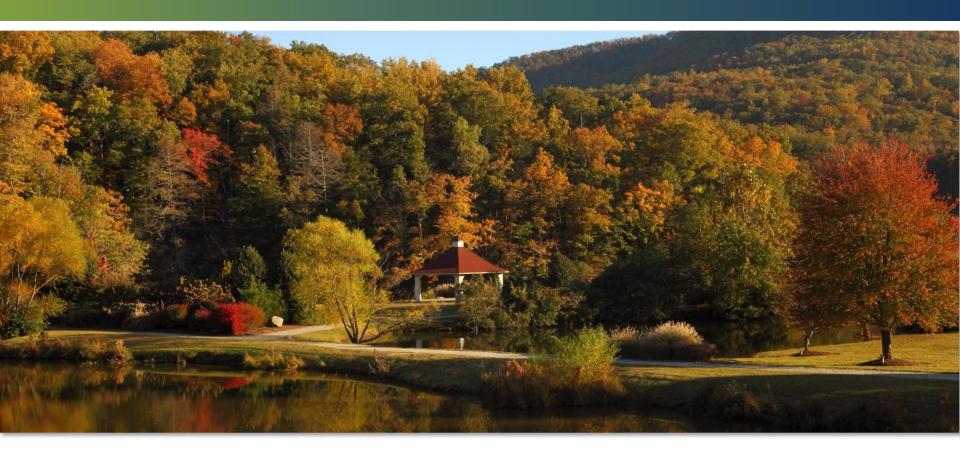


What is the Division of Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation?

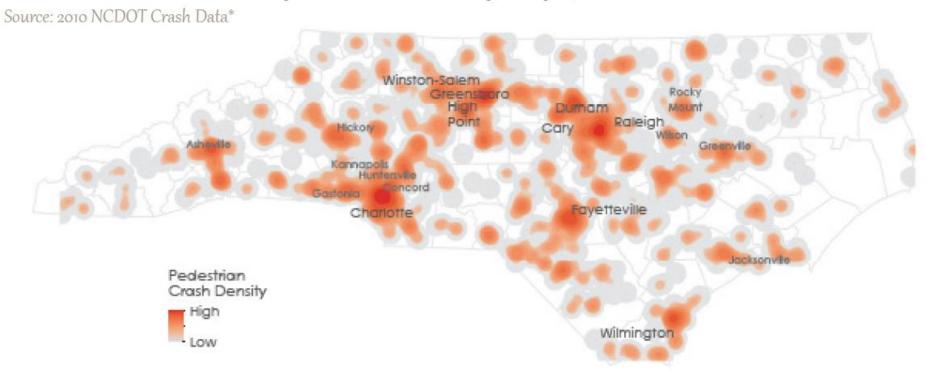

Safe Routes to School



- Safe Routes to School is a national and international movement to enable and encourage children, including those with disabilities, to walk and bicycle to school.
- Several important initiatives are a direct result of the North Carolina Safe Routes to School Program:
- The Active Routes to School program encourages students to increase activity on the way to and while at school. The program receives funding through the NCDOT Safe Routes to School program and administered through the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.

Policy Context for Bicycle/Pedestrian Accommodations





Policies on Bicycle/Pedestrian Accommodations

These agency policies determine accommodation and cost-share for bicycle and pedestrian facilities within NCDOT projects and roadways:

Administrative Action to Include Greenway Plans (1994, 2015)

- Guides the consideration of greenways/crossings during the highway planning process
- Allows inclusion of greenway crossing/element as an incidental to the highway expenditure

Guidelines for Inclusion of Greenway Accommodations Underneath a Bridge as Part of a NCDOT Project (2015)

- Clarifies the 1994 Administrative Action above
- Gives a process for NCDOT staff to use in determining if a planned greenway should be accommodated under a bridge
- Establishes cost-share provisions if the greenway is accommodated

Pedestrian Policy (1993, 2001)

- Allows NCDOT to participate with municipalities in construction of sidewalks as incidental features of highway improvement projects
- Municipality must agree to maintain the sidewalk, and share in 20-50% of cost

Bridge Policy (1994)

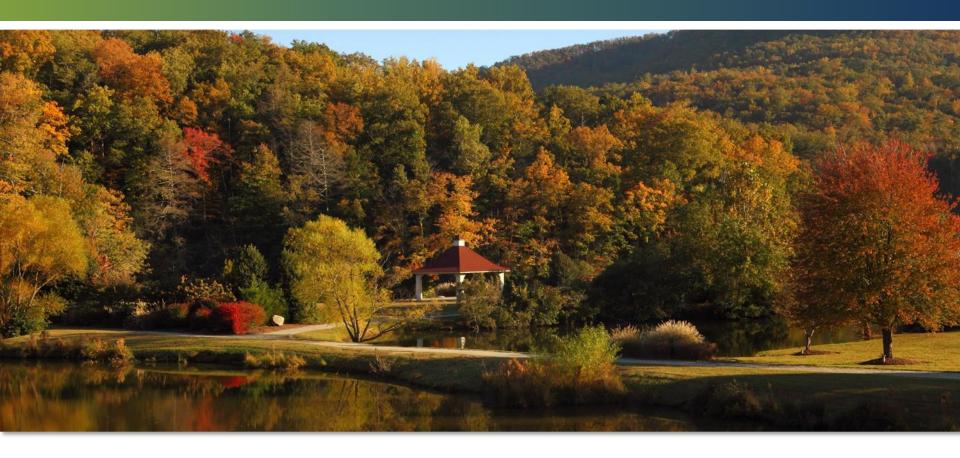
- · Determines accommodation and design for sidewalks and bicycle facilities on bridges
- Cost share established by reference to Pedestrian Policy

Complete Streets Policy (2009)

 Directs NCDOT to consider and incorporate all modes when building new projects or making improvements to existing infrastructure

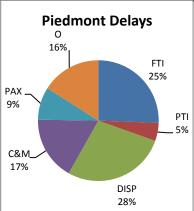

"Game-changing" Carolina Connector Intermodal Terminal to be built in Rocky Mount

Governor Pat McCrory announced July 19 that Rocky Mount was selected as the site for CSX's Carolina Connector Intermodal Terminal (CCX). This infrastructure project will bring jobs and economic opportunity to eastern North Carolina and position the state as a hub for enhanced freight movement. Building the facility

is expected to create

250 to 300 short-term jobs in engineering, technical services and construction. Operation of the terminal will provide 149 CSX jobs by 2025 and 236 jobs in 2035. CCX will directly employ 149 workers at salaries averaging \$64,047 per year. Currently, the average annual wage in Edgecombe County is \$32,725.

CSX conservatively estimates that the hub and trucking activity back and forth to the facility is expected to create 1,500 jobs in North Carolina. NCDOT's studies used comparisons with similar intermodal facilities to estimate the intermodal hub facility in Rocky Mount will create between 8,000 and 20,000 indirect and induced jobs in the state.

"This historic project is part of our 25-year vision for transportation because it facilitates efficient and cost-effective movement of goods, which is critical for job creation and economic growth," said Governor McCrory. "The Carolina Connector will be a game-changer for our state's economy, supporting North Carolina's agriculture, ports and position as the Southeast's No. 1 state for manufacturing jobs."

CSX will invest \$160 million in the project. In North Carolina, CSX maintains an intermodal terminal in Charlotte, bulk transfer terminals in Charlotte, Raleigh, Wilmington and Winston-Salem and major rail yards in Hamlet and Rocky Mount.

Intermodal hubs improve efficiency in distributing containerized goods, primarily consumer and household products, from the point of production to retailers and consumers. CCX will transfer containerized cargo between trains and trucks, and serve as a

hub for intermodal train movements, providing North Carolina direct access to all domestic markets and ports on the CSX system.

Transporting goods by rail offers numerous benefits including reduced truck traffic and wear and tear on highways, improved air quality and highway safety, and more environmentally-friendly and cost effective movement

of freight. One intermodal train can carry the load of 280 trucks.

"The close proximity of Rocky Mount to CSX's main north-south line, I-95 and the future I-87 corridor, as well as convenient access to the Raleigh economic center made this an ideal location for a regional transportation hub," N.C. Transportation Secretary Nick Tennyson said. "This project builds on the investments we have made in our rail system, our ports and other infrastructure to help us meet growing logistics demands and improve the movement of goods throughout North Carolina."

North Carolina's Transportation Department will contribute \$100 million for track improvements as well as terminal infrastructure through the state's new transportation funding formula (Strategic Transportation Investments), which Governor McCrory championed to take the politics out of transportation planning.

The intermodal terminal hub and associated track improvements are expected to be completed and open in 2020. Carolinas Gateway Partnership, the local economic development organization, controls nearly all of the land needed for the facility, which is located along CSX's main rail line in a primarily industrial area.

Many partners were involved in the development of this project including North Carolina's Transportation, Commerce, and Revenue departments as well as the Economic Development Partnership of N.C., Edgecombe County, the Carolinas Gateway Partnership and North Carolina Wesleyan College.

New Direct Intermodal Rail Service to Connect Port of Wilmington and Charlotte

Governor Pat McCrory joined officials from the N.C. Transportation Department and CSX Corporation on July 19 at the Port of Wilmington to announce the debut of the new Queen City Express, an intermodal rail service between the Port of Wilmington and CSX's intermodal terminal in Charlotte.

"The Queen City Express will be the only direct freight rail service into the Greater Charlotte area from a port in North Carolina," Governor McCrory said. "The introduction of this new service will facilitate the efficient, cost-effective movement of goods between the global marketplace and one of the most significant economic centers in the southeastern United States."

CSX will eventually provide direct access from the Port of Wilmington to the Carolina Connector intermodal terminal (CCX) in Edgecombe County that Governor McCrory announced earlier in the day.

"The introduction of the Queen City Express fulfills a critical part of Governor McCrory's 25-year vision for transportation in North Carolina by strengthening freight movement throughout the state," Transportation Secretary Nick Tennyson said. "Enhancing North Carolina's rail service will decrease transportation costs for businesses and provide numerous statewide economic and environmental benefits."

CCX, along with the Queen City Express, will lower transportation costs for businesses while taking long-distance trucks off the road. Transporting goods by rail will reduce congestion and wear and tear on the state's highways, as well as improve safety and air quality. One intermodal train can eliminate as many as 280 trucks from the highway.

"CSX is proud to partner with the State of North Carolina to bring the Carolina Connector to Eastern North Carolina which will provide cheaper, faster and more environmentally-friendly connections for North Carolina's businesses and ports to domestic and international markets," said CSX Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, Michael J. Ward. "This critical infrastructure project will create jobs and spur economic development in the region, positioning Eastern North

Carolina as a transportation and logistics hub in the south."

"The return of intermodal rail to the Port of Wilmington expands our reach into an under-served market," said NC Ports Authority Executive Director Paul J. Cozza. "The Queen City Express will provide premier rail service over competing ports for existing and future container customers."

According to a recent North Carolina Ports survey, 90 percent of customers need intermodal service. The Port of Wilmington continues to see growth in containers and infrastructure, and recently welcomed its largest-ever container ship. To further expand the port's capabilities, the North Carolina State Ports Authority is moving forward with a \$100 million investment in infrastructure improvements including new cranes, an enhanced berth and a wider turning basin, with further expansion on the way. The state budget signed by Governor McCrory includes \$70 million over two years for modernization at the state ports.

Amtrak's American View Car Offers Unique View of Rail Improvement Projects

On July 26, 27 and 28 state and railroad officials had an opportunity to see the Raleigh-Charlotte Piedmont Improvement Program projects first hand and from the railroad perspective onboard Amtrak's American View theater car. Rail Division staff was on board to brief passengers in



detail on the projects, which are part of an ongoing initiative to improve safety and enhance efficiency along the state's rail corridor.

Among the passengers were N.C. Transportation Secretary Nick Tennyson and N.C. Commerce Secretary John Skvarla.

"This unique train car offers a first-hand look at the investments we are making in our state's rail system," said Secretary Tennyson. "These projects will make train travel safer and more reliable while supporting economic growth in the region."

From their seats on the theater car, passengers got an unparalleled view of the improvements, including new bridges that will separate tracks from vehicle traffic, parallel or second track, and new passing

sidings, which allow freight and passenger trains to pass each other so they can keep on schedule.

Twenty-three public railroad crossings are being eliminated, reducing the potential for train and vehicle collisions. Projects are scheduled to be complete by 2017.

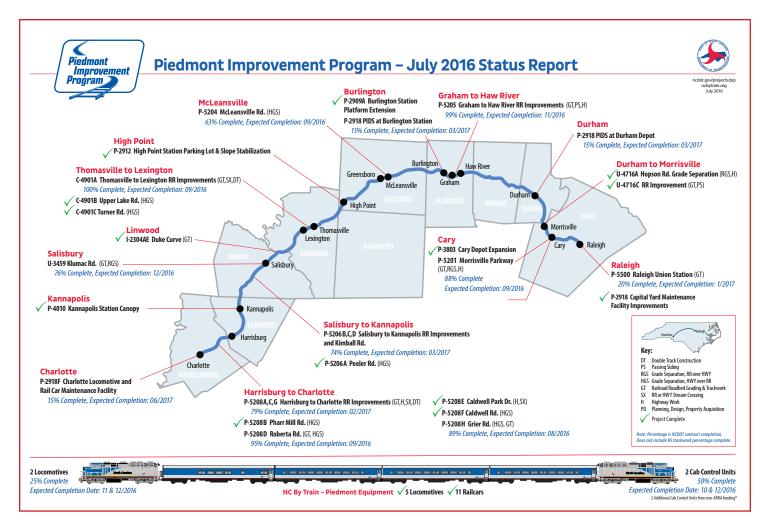
Once complete, the program will also add two passenger-train round trips between Raleigh and

Charlotte, bringing the total to five round trips daily.

On July 29, as the American View traveled back to Washington, DC, officials were able to review the site for the Carolina Connector intermodal hub and three newly installed "universal crossover" control points in Rocky Mount, Enfield and south of Weldon. The crossover tracks improve efficiency on the railroad by providing locations for trains to switch from one track to another so faster trains can maneuver around slower trains. The crossovers were funded by FRA grants.
