This cooperative agreement between the Department and FRA covers FFY2021 Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements Program (CRISI) grant funds awarded to the Department for surveys and preliminary engineering for Raleigh to Richmond (R2R) Corridor Program improvements between Raleigh, North Carolina, and Richmond, Virginia. The Department was awarded approximately \$57.9 million in FFY2021 FRA CRISI competitive grant funding. Included as a match in this project is the construction of a grade separation of Rogers Road over the S-Line in Wake Forest, North Carolina, which is funded with State funds and programmed as STIP project number P-5707. Additional matching funds are provided by the Virginia Passenger Rail Authority and Amtrak.

Federal Railroad Administration (FRA)

This cooperative agreement between the Department and the FRA covers Phases IA and II of the Raleigh to Richmond Innovating Rail Program, which will develop a new, initial phase of intercity passenger rail service between Raleigh and Wake Forest, along the S-Line. The project involves completion of final design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction activities to build additional parts of the Southeast Corridor, including new and upgraded track, grade separations, and closure of multiple at-grade crossings. The Department was awarded approximately \$1.09B FFY2022-FFY2026 FRA Federal-State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail (FSP) grant in 2023 for the project.

- Subcommittee is examining if there are better/more accurate ways to measure aspects of a project

Highway Accessibility/Connectivity Criterion:

- Criterion is currently based on two measures:
 - county economic distress
 - travel time improvement per user if mobility is improved
- County economic distress measure could be more project specific
- Many projects do not meet the threshold to qualify for the improve mobility measure
- The subcommittee is starting with reviewing the purpose

DMV Driver Services Status Updates

Definitions

Issuing Terminal: An assembly of computer hardware and applications used to issue a DMV credential.

Facilitator Station: Is a customer's first point of contact upon arrival. This examiner's primary tasks include but are not limited to, greeting customers indoor and/or outdoor, assessing purpose of visit, reviewing and verifying documents and managing the queueing (Q-Flow) process.

Workstation: A 'desk' or work area designated for an examiner, including both the Issuing Terminal and Facilitator Desk.

Citizen per Terminal (CPT): The transaction capacity of a single examiner, operating an issuing terminal annually. This is based on average transaction speed and time available to transact in a 260-day work year.

• The optimal CPT is **3,828 transactions per year**.

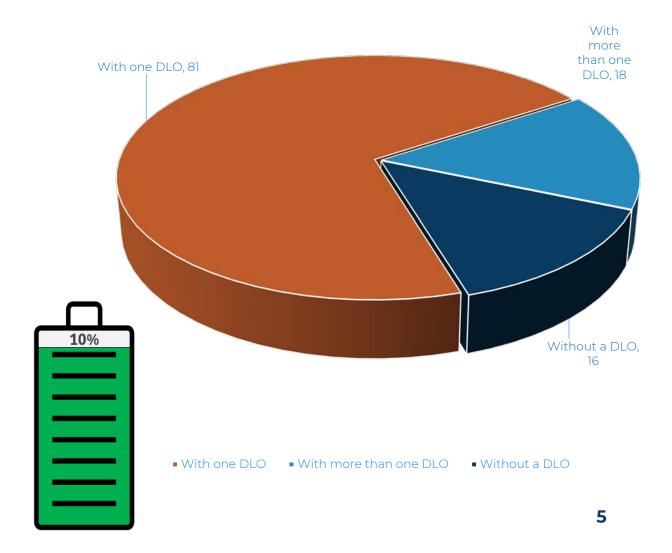
Citizens per Terminal Explained

- DLOs are open for 9 hours a day, roughly 260 days a year
- The average time to complete a transaction is 23 minutes
- DMV has the capacity to complete approx. 2,009,511 transactions per year from 538 issuing terminals
- Historically, 20% of the 10,975,017 population visit a DLO annually
 - > Approx. 2,048,903 citizens
- [2,048,903 citizens] [2,009,511 potential transactions] = 39,392 transactions not served.

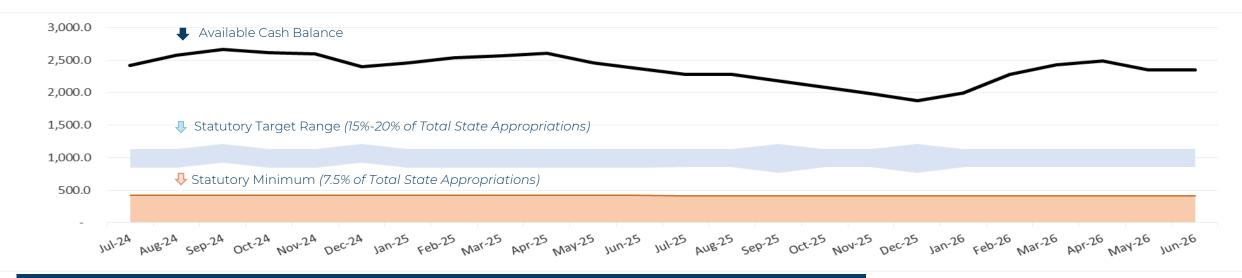

Revenues and Other Receipts Commentary

- November revenues and other receipts are 10.3% or \$62.9M above forecast largely due to FHWA and Turnpike federal aid receipts and partly due to License and Fees. Lower than anticipated sales tax revenue and Infra Grant receipts offset the higher receipts for the month of November
- Federal Aid Infra Grant was below forecast by \$28.6M due to a delay in the Alligator River Bridge project.
- FYTD revenues and other receipts are 3.4% or \$106.3M above forecast.
- HF and HTF revenues show YOY growth;7.4% and 2.6%, respectively.

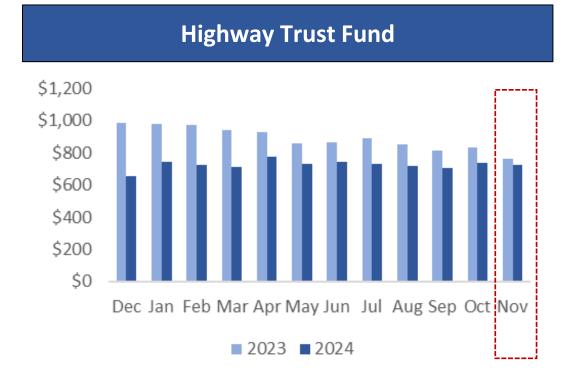

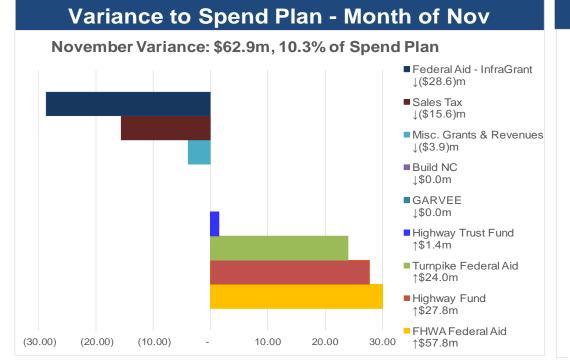
HTF cash balance decreased by \$36.6M or 4.8% from November 2023 to November 2024.

- Federal Aid Infra Grant was below forecast by \$28.6M due to a delay in the Alligator River Bridge project.
- Highway Fund and Highway Trust fund were above forecast by \$27.8M and \$1.4M, respectively.

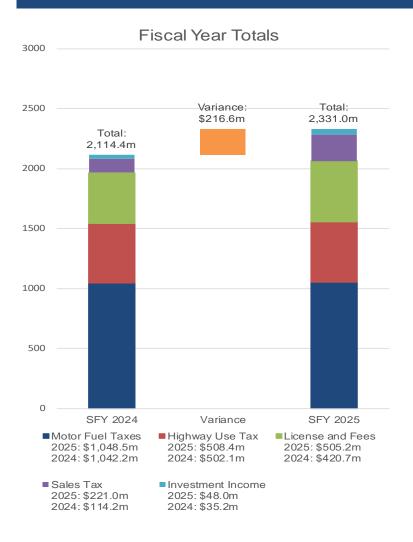

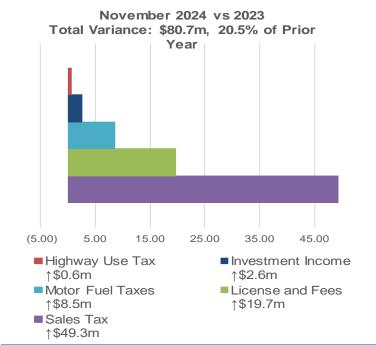

Monthly YoY Variance

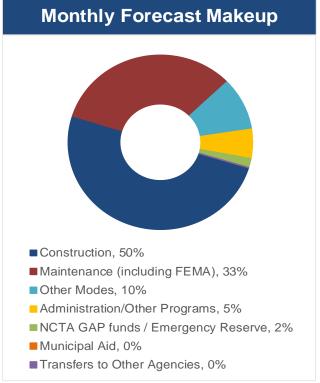

Overall Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

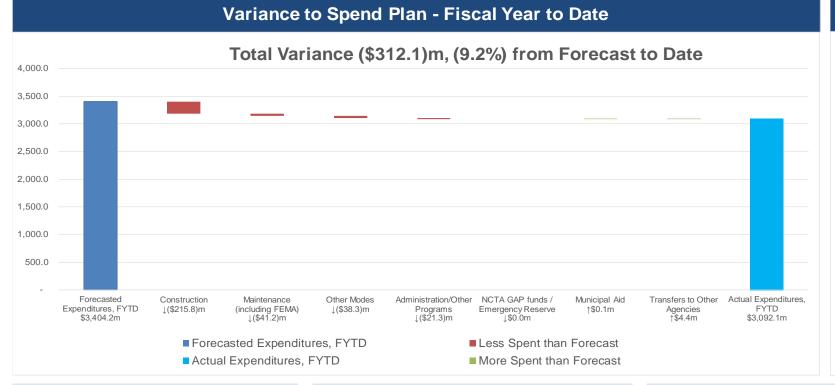

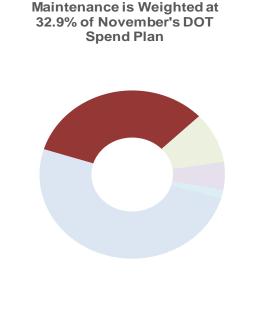

Maintenance Expenditures and Other Disbursements –Actuals vs Forecast– Monthly (\$M)





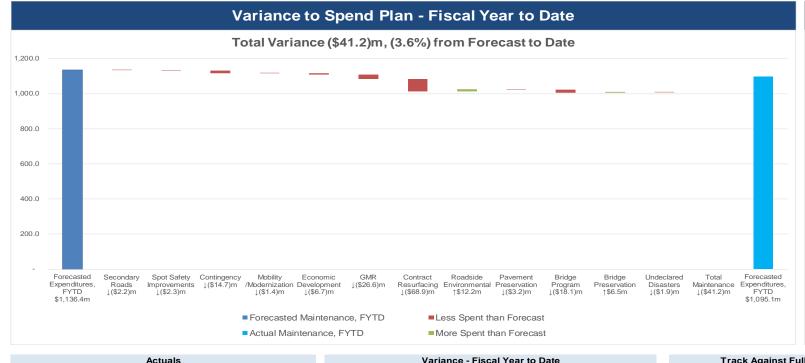

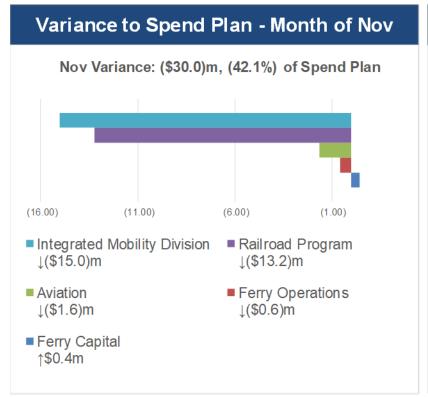
Maintenance Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – FYTD (\$M)

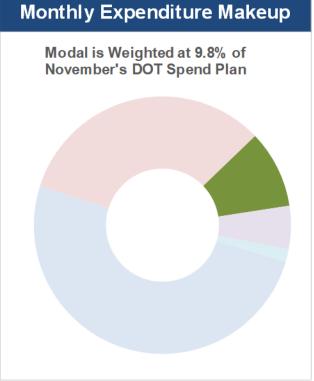

Modal Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

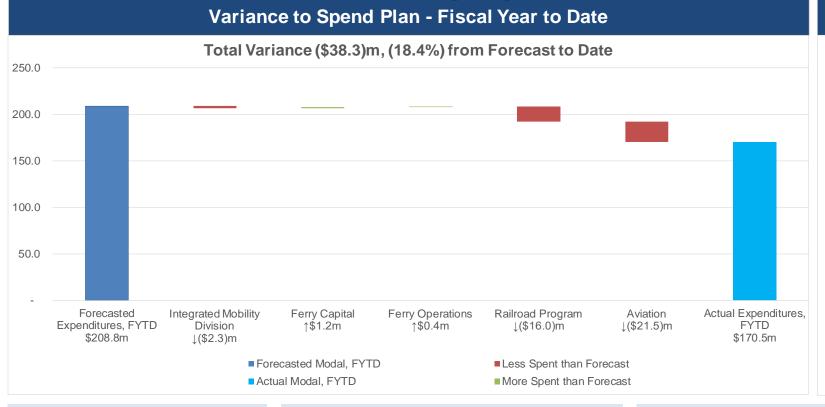

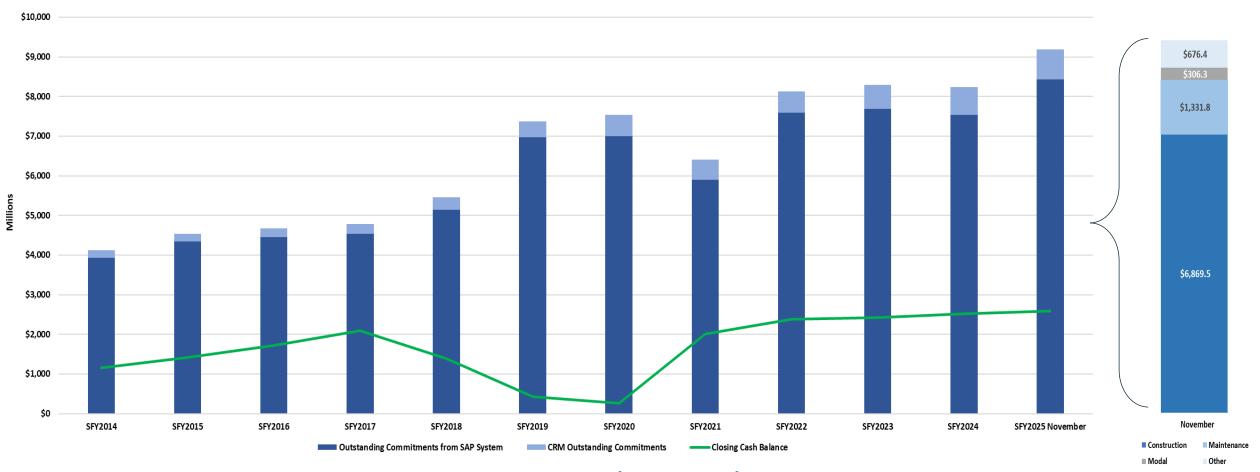

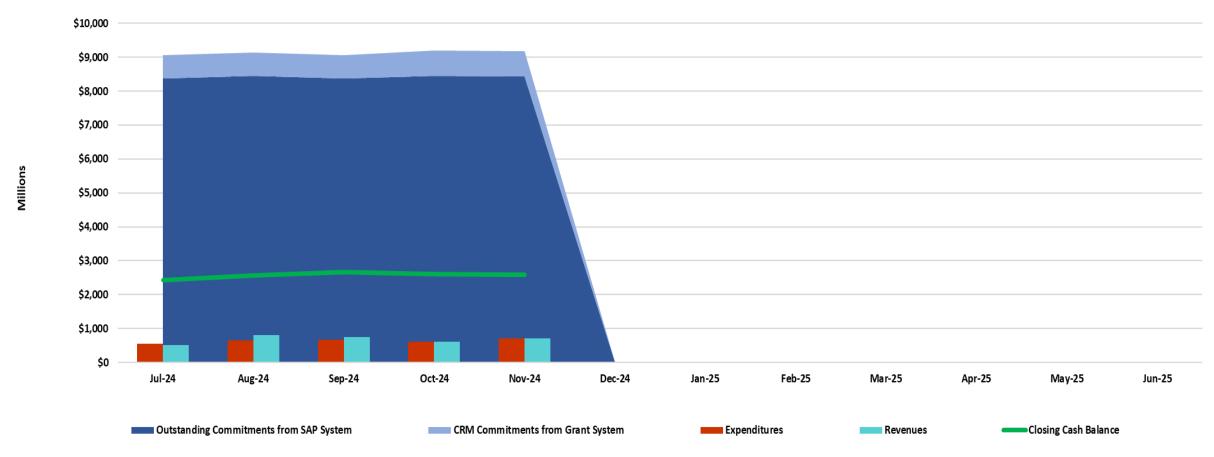
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Available Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year



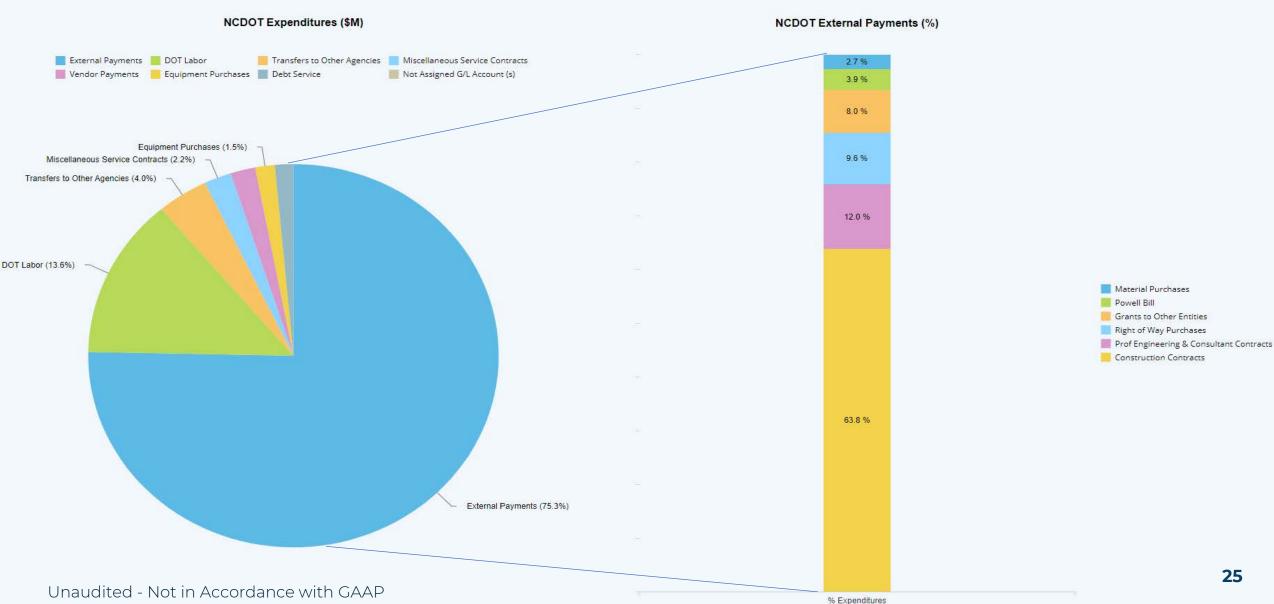

NCDOT Expenditures SFY2025 as of November 30, 2024



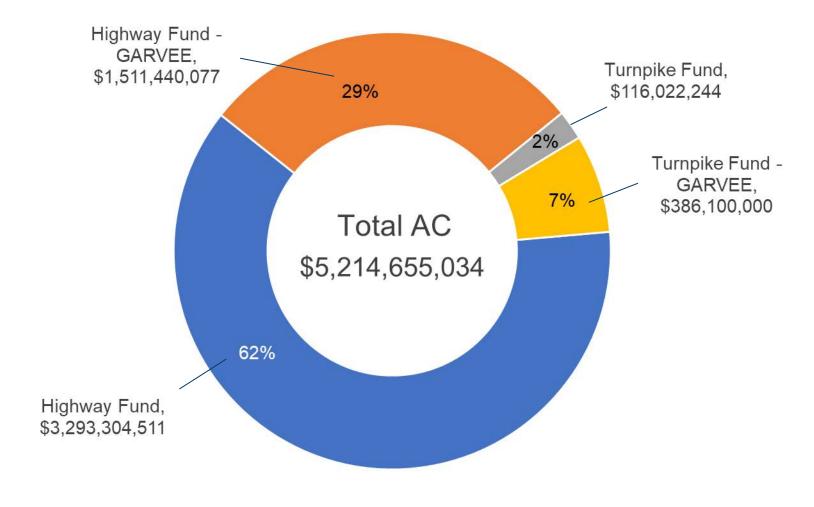

North Carolina Department of Transportation's mission is "Connecting people, products, and places safely and efficiently with customer focus, accountability and environmental sensitivity to enhance the economy and vitality of North Carolina." The Office of Inspector General conducts audits, reviews and investigations to assist the Secretary and agency in fulfilling this mission.

Executive Summary

We are pleased to present the results of the Office of Inspector General Annual Risk Assessment and Internal Audit Plan. The Internal Audit Plan consists of a risk-based approach to provide the most effective coverage of the North Carolina Department of Transportation's (Department) programs, systems and contracts with outside entities. The risk assessment was developed based on input from executive and senior level management and OIG staff.

The audit engagements outlined in the Internal Audit Plan address various operations of the Department and seek to optimize the use of our resources. The plan includes an allocation of 10,400 audit hours and will guide our activities throughout the year. The plan will be adjusted to meet management needs as deemed necessary when other priorities are identified.

Introduction

The North Carolina Department of Transportation Office of Inspector General (OIG) has developed an Internal Audit plan for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, which includes five carryover engagements from the 2023-2024 Audit Plan in addition to engagements based on a current year assessment. The assessment encompasses a risk-based approach. This approach is in keeping with the Institute of Internal Auditors' *International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing* (IIA Standards), the United States Government Accountability Office *Government Auditing Standards* (Generally Accepted Government Auditing Standards) and the Internal Audit Act (NCGS § 143-746) which generally requires the development of a risk-based audit plan. The risk-based audit approach ensures audit resources are allocated effectively and efficiently to assist management in the identification of risk and concerns impacting the organization's operations.

While the initial work plan is developed based on a risk assessment process, risks change throughout the year. Therefore, we will continuously assess risks within the Department and revise the audit plan as needed.

Risk Assessment and Audit Plan Process

OIG identified auditable units within NCDOT by reviewing organizational charts in addition to verifying with each member of executive and senior management the areas under their span of control. Assessment questionnaires were developed using eight risk categories which were aligned with risk events which impact or could potentially impact the Department, Division(s) or Unit(s). Within each risk factor, there were multiple questions designed to determine the area of risk for the area. The questionnaires were distributed to executive and senior levels of management throughout the Department.

The following are eight risk categories utilized in the assessment questionnaires:

- 1) Strategic Risks related to not having a strategic plan or goals and objectives in place.
- 2) *Financial* Risks related to financial exposure: thresholds, budget development, budget to actual revenue and expenditure monitoring and spending for necessary and reasonable costs. Number of transactions. Exposure due to risk and ineffective controls.
- 3) *Operational* Risks related to turnover, management experience, training, policies and procedures, complexity of operations, planned changes and business continuity plan.
- 4) Information Technology Risks related to usage and reliance of technology.
- 5) *Public & Political Sensitivity* Risks related to media exposure, public exposure and political exposure.
- 6) Compliance Risks related to regulatory requirements for federal, state, local or other oversight. Engagements and findings. Legal exposure.
- 7) Fraud, Waste, Abuse and Misconduct Risks related to ongoing challenges to ensure all operations are running as should be. Corruption, asset misappropriation, errors, or fraudulent financial activities are kept to a minimum. Reporting process.
- 8) *Criticality of Unit* Risks related to customer base both internally and externally. Effect on citizens.

Responses to the assessment questionnaires were evaluated and discussions were held with executive and senior levels of management to obtain additional information about areas of risk and concerns. Managements' responses were rated and scored in terms of high, moderate and low risk. Weight factors were also considered to the impact and likelihood of occurrence for each risk factor. We calculated the composite score for each risk factor. We also determined and identified auditable activities for inclusion in the audit plan based on the risk scoring. The highest areas of risks were identified in the *Accounting Operations and Budget: Payroll & Insurance* and the *Turnpike Authority*. There were also three areas for consideration that were proposed by the Secretary's office.

Developing the Internal Audit Plan

The following methodology was used to develop the FYE 2025 Internal Audit Plan:

- 1) Audit engagement which was in progress at the close of the 2024 fiscal year.
- 2) Reviewed engagements listed on FYE 2023-2024 Audit Plan which were not started.
- 3) Included reoccurring engagement for annual testing of agency financial, information technology general and end-user computing controls (*EAGLE*).
- 4) Evaluated the results of the current year risk assessment for prioritization of audit areas.
- 5) Allocated staffing hours to two engagements in progress, five carryforward engagements, one reoccurring engagement, three engagements resulting from the Secretary's office and two engagements resulting from the risk assessments.
- 6) Allocated unscheduled staffing hours for management requests, special projects, administrative, training and paid time off.

Allocation of Audit Hours

The Internal Audit Unit is comprised of four auditors and a manager. The Internal Audit Unit will expend approximately 10,400 total hours on audit plan engagements as follows:

While general audit objectives are included in the plan for auditable activities resulting from the risk assessment, specific audit objectives will be determined during the planning phases of the engagements. During the planning phase, the Internal Audit Unit will use preliminary questionnaires and conduct research and interviews to gain an understanding of the respective department(s), unit(s) or functions and to develop the specific audit objectives. Most engagements presented in the plan will be conducted as compliance or performance audits. Projected hours are preliminary estimates and will be evaluated and finalized during the audit planning phase.

The Internal Audit Plan is subject to change as management priorities change and new risks are identified.

Internal Audit Charter for the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT)

Purpose

The purpose of the internal audit function is to strengthen NCDOT's ability to create, protect, and sustain value by providing the audit committee and management with independent, risk-based, and objective assurance, advice, insight, and foresight.

The internal audit function enhances NCDOT's:

- Successful achievement of its objectives.
- Governance, risk management, and control processes.
- Decision-making and oversight.
- Reputation and credibility with its stakeholders.
- Ability to serve the public interest.

NCDOT's internal audit function is most effective when:

- Internal auditing is performed by competent professionals in conformance with The IIA's Global Internal Audit Standards[™], which are set in the public interest.
- The internal audit function is independently positioned with direct accountability to the audit committee.
- Internal auditors are free from undue influence and committed to making objective assessments.

Commitment to Adhering to the Global Internal Audit Standards

NCDOT's internal audit function will adhere to the mandatory elements of The Institute of Internal Auditors' International Professional Practices Framework, which are the Global Internal Audit Standards and Topical Requirements. The chief audit executive will report periodically to the audit committee and senior management regarding the internal audit function's conformance with the Standards, which will be assessed through a quality assurance and improvement program.

Mandate

Authority

The NCDOT's internal audit function mandate is found in Article 79, Chapter143-745--749 of the NC General Statutes, which states that a State agency shall establish a program of internal auditing that: (1) Promotes an effective system of internal controls that safeguards public funds and assets and minimizes incidences of fraud, waste, and abuse, (2) Determines if programs and business operations are administered in compliance with federal and state laws,

regulations, and other requirements, (3) Reviews the effectiveness and efficiency of agency and program operations and service delivery, (4) Periodically audits the agency's major systems and controls, including: a. Accounting systems and controls. b. Administrative systems and controls. c. Information technology systems and controls, considers: (a1) Key Performance Indicators and Criteria, (b) Internal Audit Standards, (c) Appointment and Qualifications of Internal Auditors, (d) Director of Internal Auditing, (e) Insufficient Personnel, and (f) Reporting Fraudulent Activity. 143-745 references definitions, intent and applicability. 143-747 references the Council of Internal Auditing. 143-748 references the confidentiality of internal audit work papers. 143-749 references the obstruction of audit.

The internal audit function's authority is created by its direct reporting relationship to the audit committee. Such authority allows for unrestricted access to the audit committee.

The audit committee authorizes the internal audit function to:

- Have full and unrestricted access to all functions, data, records, information, physical
 property, and personnel pertinent to carrying out internal audit responsibilities. Internal
 auditors are accountable for confidentiality and safeguarding records and information.
- Allocate resources, set frequencies, select subjects, determine scopes of work, apply techniques, and issue communications to accomplish the function's objectives.
- Obtain assistance from the necessary personnel of NCDOT and other specialized services from within or outside NCDOT to complete internal audit services.

Independence, Organizational Position, and Reporting Relationships

The chief audit executive will be positioned at a level in the organization that enables internal audit services and responsibilities to be performed without interference from management, thereby establishing the independence of the internal audit function. (See "Mandate" section.) The chief audit executive will report functionally to the audit committee and administratively (for example, day-to-day operations) to the Secretary. This positioning provides the organizational authority and status to bring matters directly to senior management and escalate matters to the audit committee, when necessary, without interference and supports the internal auditors' ability to maintain objectivity.

The chief audit executive will confirm to the audit committee, at least annually, the organizational independence of the internal audit function. If the governance structure does not support organizational independence, the chief audit executive will document the characteristics of the governance structure limiting independence and any safeguards employed to achieve the principle of independence. The chief audit executive will disclose to the audit committee any interference internal auditors encounter related to the scope, performance, or communication of internal audit work and results. The disclosure will include communicating the implications of such interference on the internal audit function's effectiveness and ability to fulfill its mandate.

Changes to the Mandate and Charter

Circumstances may justify a follow-up discussion between the chief audit executive, audit committee, and senior management on the internal audit mandate or other aspects of the internal audit charter. Such circumstances may include but are not limited to:

- A significant change in the Global Internal Audit Standards.
- A significant reorganization within the organization.
- Significant changes in the chief audit executive, audit committee, and/or senior management.
- Significant changes to the organization's strategies, objectives, risk profile, or the environment in which the organization operates.
- New laws or regulations that may affect the nature and/or scope of internal audit services.

Audit Committee Oversight

To establish, maintain, and ensure that NCDOT's internal audit function has sufficient authority to fulfill its duties, the audit committee will:

- Discuss with the chief audit executive and senior management the appropriate authority, role, responsibilities, scope, and services (assurance and/or advisory) of the internal audit function.
- Ensure the chief audit executive has unrestricted access to and communicates and interacts directly with the audit committee, including in private meetings without senior management present.
- Discuss with the chief audit executive and senior management other topics that should be included in the internal audit charter.
- Participate in discussions with the chief audit executive and senior management about the "essential conditions," described in the Global Internal Audit Standards, which establish the foundation that enables an effective internal audit function.
- Approve the internal audit function's charter, which includes the internal audit mandate and the scope and types of internal audit services.
- Review the internal audit charter annually with the chief audit executive to consider changes affecting the organization, such as the employment of a new chief audit executive or changes in the type, severity, and interdependencies of risks to the organization; and approve the internal audit charter annually.
- Approve the risk-based internal audit plan.
- Offer suggestions as needed to the internal audit function's human resources administration and budgets.
- Inquire as needed the internal audit function's expenses.
- Provide input to senior management on the appointment and removal of the chief audit executive, ensuring adequate competencies and qualifications and conformance with the Global Internal Audit Standards.

- Review and provide input to senior management on the chief audit executive's performance.
- Receive communications from the chief audit executive about the internal audit function including its performance relative to its plan.
- Ensure a quality assurance and improvement program has been established and review the results annually.
- Make appropriate inquiries of senior management and the chief audit executive to determine whether scope or resource limitations are inappropriate.

Chief Audit Executive Roles and Responsibilities

Ethics and Professionalism

The chief audit executive will ensure that internal auditors:

- Conform with the Global Internal Audit Standards, including the principles of Ethics and Professionalism: integrity, objectivity, competency, due professional care, and confidentiality.
- Understand, respect, meet, and contribute to the legitimate and ethical expectations of the organization and be able to recognize conduct that is contrary to those expectations.
- Encourage and promote an ethics-based culture in the organization.
- Report organizational behavior that is inconsistent with the organization's ethical expectations, as described in applicable policies and procedures.

Objectivity

The chief audit executive will ensure that the internal audit function remains free from all conditions that threaten the ability of internal auditors to carry out their responsibilities in an unbiased manner, including matters of engagement selection, scope, procedures, frequency, timing, and communication. If the chief audit executive determines that objectivity may be impaired in fact or appearance, the details of the impairment will be disclosed to appropriate parties.

Internal auditors will maintain an unbiased mental attitude that allows them to perform engagements objectively such that they believe in their work product, do not compromise quality, and do not subordinate their judgment on audit matters to others, either in fact or appearance.

Internal auditors will have no direct operational responsibility or authority over any of the activities they review. Accordingly, internal auditors will not implement internal controls, develop procedures, install systems, or engage in other activities that may impair their judgment, including:

- Assessing specific operations for which they had responsibility within the previous year.
- Performing operational duties for NCDOT or its affiliates.

- Initiating or approving transactions external to the internal audit function.
- Directing the activities of any NCDOT employee that is not employed by the internal audit function, except to the extent that such employees have been appropriately assigned to internal audit teams or to assist internal auditors.

Internal auditors will:

- Disclose impairments of independence or objectivity, in fact or appearance, to appropriate parties and at least annually, such as the chief audit executive, audit committee, management, or others.
- Exhibit professional objectivity in gathering, evaluating, and communicating information.
- Make balanced assessments of all available and relevant facts and circumstances.
- Take necessary precautions to avoid conflicts of interest, bias, and undue influence.

Managing the Internal Audit Function

The chief audit executive has the responsibility to:

- At least annually, develop a risk-based internal audit plan that considers the input of the audit committee and senior management. Discuss the plan with the audit committee and senior management and submit the plan to the audit committee for review and approval.
- Communicate the impact of resource limitations on the internal audit plan to the audit committee and senior management.
- Review and adjust the internal audit plan, as necessary, in response to changes in NCDOT's business, risks, operations, programs, systems, and controls.
- Communicate with the audit committee and senior management if there are significant interim changes to the internal audit plan.
- Ensure internal audit engagements are performed, documented, and communicated in accordance with the Global Internal Audit Standards and laws and/or regulations.
- Follow up on engagement findings and confirm the implementation of recommendations or action plans and communicate the results of internal audit services to the audit committee and senior management periodically and for each engagement as appropriate.
- Ensure the internal audit function collectively possesses or obtains the knowledge, skills, and other competencies and qualifications needed to meet the requirements of the Global Internal Audit Standards and fulfill the internal audit mandate.
- Identify and consider trends and emerging issues that could impact NCDOT and communicate to the audit committee and senior management as appropriate.
- Consider emerging trends and successful practices in internal auditing.
- Establish and ensure adherence to methodologies designed to guide the internal audit function.

- Ensure adherence to NCDOT's relevant policies and procedures unless such policies and procedures conflict with the internal audit charter or the Global Internal Audit Standards. Any such conflicts will be resolved or documented and communicated to the audit committee and senior management.
- Coordinate activities and consider relying upon the work of other internal and external
 providers of assurance and advisory services. If the chief audit executive cannot achieve
 an appropriate level of coordination, the issue must be communicated to senior
 management and if necessary escalated to the audit committee.

Communication with the Audit Committee and Senior Management

The chief audit executive will report periodically to the audit committee and senior management regarding:

- The internal audit function's mandate.
- The internal audit plan and performance relative to its plan.
- Internal audit budget.
- Significant revisions to the internal audit plan and budget.
- Potential impairments to independence, including relevant disclosures as applicable.
- Results from the quality assurance and improvement program, which include the internal audit function's conformance with The IIA's Global Internal Audit Standards and action plans to address the internal audit function's deficiencies and opportunities for improvement.
- Significant risk exposures and control issues, including fraud risks, governance issues, and other areas of focus for the audit committee that could interfere with the achievement of NCDOT's strategic objectives.
- Results of assurance and advisory services.
- Resource requirements.
- Management's responses to risk that the internal audit function determines may be unacceptable or acceptance of a risk that is beyond NCDOT's risk appetite.

Quality Assurance and Improvement Program

The chief audit executive will develop, implement, and maintain a quality assurance and improvement program that covers all aspects of the internal audit function. The program will include external and internal assessments of the internal audit function's conformance with the Global Internal Audit Standards, as well as performance measurement to assess the internal audit function's progress toward the achievement of its objectives and promotion of continuous improvement. The program also will assess, if applicable, compliance with laws and/or regulations relevant to internal auditing. Also, if applicable, the assessment will include plans to address the internal audit function's deficiencies and opportunities for improvement.

Annually, the chief audit executive will communicate with the audit committee and senior management about the internal audit function's quality assurance and improvement program, including the results of internal assessments (ongoing monitoring and periodic self-assessments) and external assessments. External assessments will be conducted at least once every three years by a qualified, independent assessor or assessment team from outside NCDOT; qualifications must include at least one assessor holding an active Certified Internal Auditor® credential.

Scope and Types of Internal Audit Services

The scope of internal audit services covers the entire breadth of the organization, including all of NCDOT's activities, assets, and personnel. The scope of internal audit activities also encompasses, but is not limited to, objective examinations of evidence to provide independent assurance and advisory services to the audit committee and management on the adequacy and effectiveness of governance, risk management, and control processes for NCDOT.

The nature and scope of advisory services may be agreed with the party requesting the service, provided the internal audit function does not assume management responsibility. Opportunities for improving the efficiency of governance, risk management, and control processes may be identified during advisory engagements. These opportunities will be communicated to the appropriate level of management.

Internal audit engagements may include evaluating whether:

- Risks relating to the achievement of NCDOT's strategic objectives are appropriately identified and managed.
- The actions of NCDOT's officers, directors, management, employees, and contractors or other relevant parties comply with NCDOT's policies, procedures, and applicable laws, regulations, and governance standards.
- The results of operations/performance, compliance, financial, IT, etc., and programs are consistent with established goals and objectives.
- Operations/performance, compliance, financial, IT, etc., and programs are being carried out effectively, efficiently, ethically, and equitably.
- Established processes and systems enable compliance with the policies, procedures, laws, and regulations that could significantly impact NCDOT.
- The integrity of information and the means used to identify, measure, analyze, classify, and report such information is reliable.
- Resources and assets are acquired economically, used efficiently and sustainably, and protected adequately.
